Lent is almost here.

This year, Lent begins on February 14th with Ash Wednesday. We will gather the night before on February 13th, as we have done for several years, for **Shrove Tuesday**. After a sweet, indulgent pancake supper, we will pause with a brief service to remember our own humanity, the fragility of life marked by the imposition of serve us, purge the clutter and clear the shelves of ashes. Here's a bit of a refresher about Lent.

Lent is a season of 40 days. The time between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday is actually 46 days,

but we don't count Sundays because they are considered "mini Easters." In fact, liturgically, every Sunday in church is a "mini Easter" when we remember God's love that over powers death, shown to us in Jesus.

The word Lent comes from ancient Anglo-Saxon word lencten, or "lengthen" or the lengthening of days of spring. And 40 days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of evil and preparing for his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, turning from the normal day to day of things, fasting from something and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of selfexamination and reflection.

In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on relationship with God, growing as people of faith and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something like chocolate or wine or to volunteer or give of ourselves for others.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This is a good time of the year to think of cleaning out our closets of clothes that might serve someone else better; stuff we have not worn for a while, for whatever reason.

This is a good time of year to reassess after the Christmas rush, to get rid of things that no longer extra junk. And in the practice of this cleansing, we just may find more space for God in our lives.

In this practice of cleansing, and reassessing we make space in our souls for wondrous encounters

> of the world God has made and continues to make around us.

During Lent, we will have a a 4-week Lenten Study using the book,

Wondrous Encounters by Richard Rohr.

We will meet on Feb 25, March 3, 10 and 17th. hybrid, in the Guild room and on ZOOM at 11:45 AM.

There are copies of the book at church if you wish, call Rev. Holly for your copy.

Let us all take time this Lenten season to give room for God in our lives.

We find in the gospel of Luke a reminder of what God has in store for us –

"Full measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over will be poured into your lap, because the measure you measure out with will be measured back to you." (Luke 6:38)


